





CALL FOR PAPERS - INTERNATIONAL MEDITERRANEAN SURVEY WORKSHOP FALL 2024

German Archaeological Institute İstanbul and Mimar Sinan Fine Arts University invite you to the 47th International Mediterranean Survey (IMS) workshop, which will be held on Friday 6th and Saturday 7th of December 2024. The venues of the workshop are MSGSÜ Sedad Hakkı Eldem Oditorium, Fındıklı on Friday 6th and ANAMED Oditorium on Saturday 7th. Both venues are in Beyoğlu, İstanbul in walking distance and the area is well connected from both airports via shuttle.

The IMS workshops are biannual informal meetings, where you and your team members can present/explore/test survey-related research of recent fieldwork and methodological studies. For the 2024 IMS fall workshop in İstanbul we welcome papers on

- ongoing survey projects
- desktop analysis of survey data
- theoretical approaches and practices of advanced innovative methodologies in survey archaeology

We welcome proposals for 20-minute papers (+ 10-min discussion) that cover these themes or any other topic related to survey archaeology, through specific case studies or by wider theoretical and methodological reflection.

 One session will be dedicated to the memory of late Prof.Dr. Hans Lohmann who is a pioneer in Mediterranean survey archaeology. Any contributions on his work and legacy is very much welcomed.

Please send an e-mail with a short abstract in English of your proposal before **October 30th, 2024** to ims.istanbul2024@gmail.com. Abstracts should include name and surname, affiliation, e-mail, and abstract text (max. 200 words).

A preliminary programme and detailed logistical information (i.e. travelling, lodging, social programme, registration for in person attendance and online participation) will be circulated by early November 2024.
